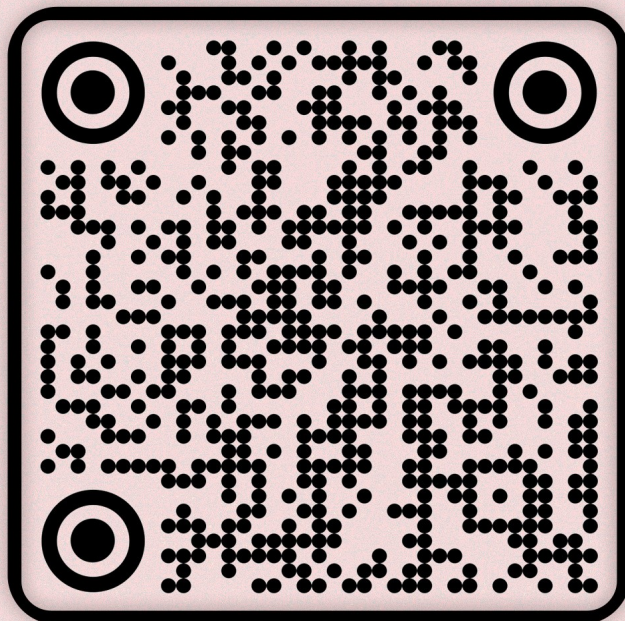




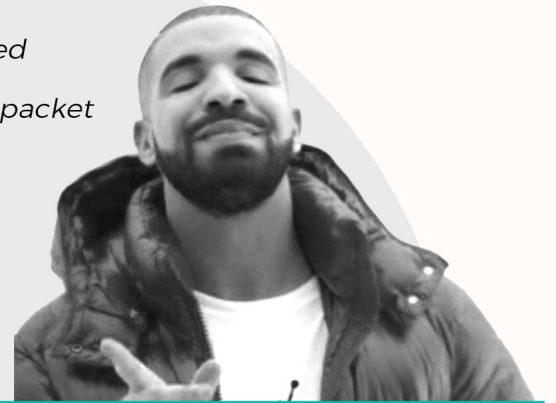

OFFICIAL GBSM DRESS CODE

All apparel judgements will be left to the discretion of the GBSM adult youth leaders (AYL) or event staff (ES). If AYL or ES determine a camper or campers should change their clothing to fall in line with group requirements, then said camper or campers are required to do so.

ALWAYS ACCEPTABLE SHIRTS

Shorts must extend to or beyond the campers' finger tips or have a 5" inseam, not rolled or hiked up.



Dresses/Skirts must reach the top of the knee while seated.

Shoes must be worn at all times outside of the lodging areas.



T-shirts and cover-ups must be worn to and from swimming venues.

Should wear swimsuits of modest length (fingertip) and not tight fitting

No short shorts/ or tight-fitting shorts

Campers may not be barefoot on the way to and/or from venues.

SWIMWEAR

Tights may be worn under a garment that meets the dress code. Tights/sliders do not extend the length of garments worn over them (shorts/skirts/dresses). No tight fitting or revealing clothing. Tights/Leggings may be worn as pants **ONLY** under a loose, oversized shirt that meets dress code.



No tank tops or shirts cut down the sides.



Undergarments must always be covered by outer garments (i.e. no boxer shorts hanging out or bra straps showing).



No Midriiffs/racer backs. No sport bras as tops (includes the 5K).



No spaghetti strap tanks/dresses. No tight fitting or low scoop neck tops.



WHAT NOT TO WEAR

Apparel may not display tobacco, alcohol, controlled substances, or inappropriate language or pictures.

WILD AND CRAZY REC

3 out of the 4 full days we are at camp, our entire group will be participating in what's known as Wild & Crazy Rec. These are fun, unique, water games led by the Summit Rec staff against other churches attending camp. These games are all about team building and team spirit in order to compete to the best of each church's abilities.

In addition to other clothes and items for camp, students & parents should consider these suggestions when packing specifically for this part of the week:

- ◆ **CLOTHES:** 2-3 changes of clothes especially ones you don't mind getting wet and dirty. We will try to wash clothes if we can
- ◆ **FOOTWEAR:** Ones that can get wet and dirty to protect feet from the occasional sticker + walking to and from the wet Rec Fields
 - Ⓢ Ex: old tennis shoes, chacos, water/pool shoes, flip flops, etc...
- ◆ **SPIRIT:** Every year a spirit stick is awarded to the group who shows the most team spirit, energy during the games, and fun, Christ-like competitive attitudes.
 - Ⓢ Students are encouraged to show their camp spirit for Rec time through face paint, costumes/props, or any other expression
 - Ⓢ We will have some items to use for this aspect of Rec but students may bring their own as long as they are appropriate and follow the other camp guidelines



SUMMIT CODE OF CONDUCT

- 🔥 All Campers are expected to participate in classes and worship services
- 🔥 Campers are expected to respect the camp property as well as personal property of others
- 🔥 Immodest clothing
 - 😊 *See GBSM Dress Code Page*
- 🔥 Campers are to maintain the highest moral standards of the Christian faith.
- 🔥 Tobacco, alcoholic beverages, illegal drugs, firearms, and fireworks are prohibited on the campgrounds
- 🔥 Vehicles are not to be driven on the campgrounds unless absolutely necessary.
 - 😊 *NO riding on the backs of pick-ups, SUVs, or non-passenger areas of vehicles*
 - 😊 *NO bikes, skateboards, roller blades, 4 wheelers, or golf carts are to be brought to camp unless prior approval has been given*
- 🔥 Lake and dams on site are off limits for scheduled authorized events
- 🔥 **INAPROPRIATE CONTACT:**
 - 😊 *All forms of inappropriate contact (i.e. inappropriate touching, PDA, invading someone's personal space, etc...) will not be tolerated and will be dealt with accordingly!*

KBA GUIDELINES

1. **INSTRUCTIONS**: Entrance fees and regulations issued by the Executive Board shall become a part of the camp rules.

2. **REGISTRATION**: Every person entering the campground must register and pay the registration fees.

A. All visitors (campers and sponsors) shall register at the Assembly Office.

B. Children five (5) and under shall pay half of the full registration fee during summer camp only, retreats are regular fees.

C. All persons six (6) and above shall pay full registration during camp, retreats, and day camps.

D. Anyone spending the night must pay the daily registration fee.

E. Two (2) nights and/or three (3) days equals full registration.

3. **PARTICIPATION**: Every person on the campgrounds, except cooks and KBA personnel, shall attend classes and all worship services.

4. **DRESS CODE**: Kiamichi Baptist Assembly is a Christian encampment which maintains high standards of conduct. Campers should dress respectably and uphold those standards. Campers may *not* wear tank tops, halters, spaghetti straps, translucent clothing, apparel that exposes the midriff. Apparel displaying pictures, trademarks or advertising of tobacco products, beer, alcoholic beverages or controlled substances or secular music groups are prohibited. Shoes and shirts must be worn at all times outside the cabins. Shorts of medium length may be worn, except for summer camp worship services. Skirts and dresses should be at least medium length.

A. Dress code applies to everyone registered or visiting KBA.

B. No caps or hats shall be worn during worship services.

C. Any person or group who refuses to abide by these rules shall be denied the privilege of remaining on the Assembly grounds.

5. **FAMILIARITY**: Keep it clean and Christ like. Remember in all we do that Christ should shine through. Ask yourself would I do this if Christ were standing beside me right now then remember to make new friends and have a great time.

6. **NO PERSONAL MUSIC PLAYING DEVICES** on the camp grounds except for devotional purposes. No computer games at camp.

7. **KBA PERSONNEL**: They are here to help you. They have the authority to stop you if needed and they should be respected.

8. **TOBACCO, ALCOHOL, & DRUGS ARE NOT PERMITTED** anywhere on the Assembly grounds. Tobacco includes smoking, chewing, dipping, etc.

9. **CABINS**: are owned by associations and churches. Do not enter the premises or occupy the same without permission from the owners. Trespassers can be prosecuted. Out of consideration of neighboring cabins, all cabin music must be conducted inside cabins.

10. **ASSEMBLY PROPERTY**: Help keep the camp property clean and neat for future enjoyment.

A. Do not cut, write, mark on or mar seats, walls, or any portion of the Assembly property. This is vandalism and will not be tolerated.

B. Please put trash and papers in the garbage barrels.

C. If you see trash lying around please help by picking it up and disposing of it properly.

D. No standing in seats in the tabernacle.

11. **VEHICLES**:

A. Speed limit is 15 miles per hour.

B. Please leave vehicles parked during camp, except for special circumstances, such as: handicap individuals, bad weather, emergency, etc.

C. No riding in the back of pick-up trucks or non-passenger areas of vehicles

D. Special needs individuals can get a pass which will allow them to drive or be driven to and from all services and activities.

E. No personal transportation means, such as: 4 wheelers, golf carts, bikes, skateboards, etc., except by permission for special circumstances.

F. Campers are not permitted to leave the camp grounds during the summer camps without proper authority.

12. **LAKES** are off limits at all times during camp, retreats and day camps.

13. **HORSEPLAY**: Rock throwing or shaving cream fights will not be tolerated. No water fights or fireworks, unless they are a part of the camp program. Any damage done by these acts will be charged to the individual and/or church group responsible. Also, any person so engaged will be sent home. If it is the last night, you may not be allowed to attend other functions at KBA and your church will be notified.

14. **HUNTING**: No hunting shall be permitted on the Assembly grounds.

15. **GARBAGE**: Place all garbage in heavy duty trash bags on the road at the nearest trash pole. *Please do not put liquids into the trash, pour them out before throwing away cups, etc. Please break down all boxes.*

16. **INFRACTIONS**: Any infraction concerning these rules will be brought before the Assembly Discipline Committee.

17. **PHONE CALLS**: The Assembly Office number is (918) 567-2601 and is for assembly business and **EMERGENCY CALLS ONLY!** All incoming calls should be to (918) 567-4047, the summer camp office number, during weeks other than KBA sponsored camps. No cell phones during class/tabernacle times.

18. **HEALTH FORMS**: Every person staying overnight on the campgrounds or at any retreat or day camp sponsored by KBA must have a completed health form on each camper and sponsor. The health forms should be turned into the office when you pick up your cabin key at check-in.

19. **INSURANCE CLAIMS**: Any injury or sickness needs to be reported to the Assembly Office before leaving the camp grounds to either see a doctor or to leave to go home. Make sure any questionable injury is reported before leaving at the end of your retreat or day camp, too. Insurance coverage has limits of liability, contact office if details are needed.

20. **ASSEMBLY GATES**: Gates will be locked thirty minutes after lights are out, during summer camp only. All visitors must leave before gates are locked.

21. **ATHLETICS**: The Athletic Director will arrange all schedules, rules, and regulations for all sports events during summer camp. These rules are a part of the KBA guidelines.

22. **NO SECULAR MUSIC** played during camp.

23. **LOST & FOUND** is located in the Assembly Office or Summer Office. Please check before leaving if you have misplaced any articles. Please encourage all campers to put their name and church name on their Bibles and other belongings.

EXTRA INFORMATION

WEDNESDAY MISSIONS OFFERING

Every year Summit takes up an offering for a missions opportunity locally, nationally, or globally. This is totally optional for anyone who wants to participate by giving.

LATE NIGHT

This usually takes place on Thursday night and lasts until about midnight. The Summit Staff will set up some sort of scenario or activity for the churches to participate in. Churches are given the option of participating or not in this event.

8TH ANNUAL COLOR FUN RUN!!!

Thursday morning of Camp will be the Color Fun Run 5K. This has been such a great Event and we would love to have anyone come join the fun and help raise funds for Missions. All proceeds of the Run will go to help Summit Students and adults that are going on Mission Trips around the World!

4V4 Volleyball

- Up to 6 people to a team (may only rotate in 2)
- If ball hits line, ball is in
- Must serve from behind the line
- If serve hits net and goes over, serve is legal
- 3 hits per side
- Don't touch the net!
- No lifts
- A block is not a hit
- All players MUST rotate
- No courtesy serve on game point
- The server is not allowed to spike at the net
- You cannot block a serve (Even if your feet remain on the ground)
- You cannot break the plane of the net
- Please arrive 5 minutes before game is scheduled
- You cannot make contact under the net with any player
- Rally Scoring (don't have to serve to score)
- Games will be played to 15 until the final rounds

6V6 Volleyball

- Up to 8 people to a team (may only rotate in 2)
- Must have 2 girls playing at all times
- If ball hits line, ball is in
- Must serve from behind the line
- If serve hits net and goes over, serve is legal
- 3 hits per side
- Don't touch the net!
- All players MUST rotate (exception: 2 girls must remain in play)

- No lifts
- Only the front row players can spike the ball at the net
- A block is not a hit
- No courtesy serve on game point
- The server is not allowed to spike at the net
- You cannot block a serve
- You cannot break the plane of the net
- Please arrive 5 minutes before game is scheduled
- Rally Scoring
- Games will be played to 15 until the final rounds.

**Sponsors are NOT allowed to play*

3V3 Basketball

- Same people throughout tournament!
- Call your own fouls
- Game is won by scoring the most points in allotted time (10 Minutes)
- Keep your own score / score by 1s
- NO “make it, take it”
- Only take the ball back if it hits the rim
- Must check it!
- Please arrive 5 minutes before game is scheduled
- If a player has just finished 8th grade they are still in Junior High division
- If a game is tied after the allotted time, then the Summit Rec. Staff will add a few minutes on the clock to find a winner.
- If the game is tied at the end of the ten minutes, two additional minutes will be allotted to break tie. If at the end of the two minutes the game is still tied, the game will go into sudden death overtime.

**If a problem arises, you must notify the Rec. Staff during the game. If a problem is brought up after the game the problem will not be addressed.*

**If a game is stopped by Rec. Staff because of behavior of any other problem, that team may be disqualified.*

DODGEBALL

- THE FIELD

The playing field shall be a boundary divided into two (2) equal sections by a center boundary line.

- THE TEAM

The game shall be played between two teams of 12 maximum with 10 maximum on field at one time. A minimum of 6 players required to play. If your team doesn't have 10 they can still come play. Substitutes may enter the game only after each round.

- BEGINNING THE GAME

Game begins by placing the Dodgeballs along the center line. Players then take a position behind their end line. Following a signal by the official, teams may approach the centerline to retrieve the balls. This signal officially starts the contest.

- RUSH RULE

Each and every ball retrieved at the opening rush must first be taken beyond the attack line and into the team's backcourt before it may be legally thrown at an opponent. This means that the player cannot pick up the ball and immediately throw it at an opponent.

- THE GAME

The object of the game is to eliminate all opposing players by getting them "OUT". This may be done by:

Hitting an opposing player with a thrown ball below the shoulders.

Note: If a player ducks, and this is clearly the cause for the player being hit above the shoulders, the player is out and the throw is legal.

Catching a ball thrown by your opponent before it touches the ground.

Causing an opponent to drop a live ball as a result of contact by another thrown live ball. (usually occurs when a ball is being used to block a thrown ball.) Example: Player throws it at the opponent and the opponent uses the ball that he is holding to block the throw. If he blocks the ball and holds onto the ball he is holding, it is legal. However, if he drops the ball he is holding, he is OUT.

If a player throws the ball and hits his opponent in the head, he is automatically out and cannot return into that round.

An opposing player stepping out of bounds. (To avoid getting hit and not because he or she is retrieving a ball - in which case you have 5 seconds to retrieve a ball, and come immediately back into the playing field.)

- RETURNING TO THE GAME

The only way that a player can return into the game after he or she is out is by their teammate catching a thrown ball from their opponent or if a teammate that is playing gets hurt.

- ENDING THE GAME

The first team to legally eliminate all opposing players will be declared the winner. A 3-minute time limit has been established for each contest. If neither team has been eliminated at the end of the 3 minutes, the team with the greater number of players remaining will be declared the winner. In the case of an equal number of players remaining after regulation, a 1-minute sudden-death overtime period will be played.

- MATCHPLAY

Depending on the number of teams and amount of time, you can play matches of “best-of-three”, “best-of-five”, etc. Substitutes can only come in after each round.

Note: A live ball is a thrown ball that hasn't touched the ground or any other physical object around the playing field. A player cannot catch a ball bouncing off of a wall or any other object, but he or she can catch one that has bounced off of their teammate.

Note: If one team is holding all the Dodgeballs on the field, then they have to get rid of half of them within 5 seconds.

Cornhole Tournament

- 🏆 Each team can have 4 players, only 2 will play in each game. (This gives your team alternates if needed). Players can be campers or adults
- 🏆 The tournament will be double elimination
- 🏆 Boards will be set 27 feet apart
- 🏆 Every match is broken into innings of play. During an inning of play, each player must toss all four of his/her bags. An inning is complete when all players toss all 4 of their bags
- 🏆 Each team must stay in their designated lane for the whole game
- 🏆 Players at the headboard will alternate tossing bags until each player has tossed all 4 of their bags
- 🏆 Players at the footboard will take score and resume tossing back to the other board when their turn
- 🏆 Scoring will be done through the “cancellation method”
- 🏆 Any bag that comes to rest on the board is worth 1 point
- 🏆 Any bag that is thrown through the hole or knocked through the hole by another bag is worth 3 points
- 🏆 If a bag strikes the ground or any other object before it hits the board is considered a foul and won't count for any points
- 🏆 Do not remove any bags from the playing field until all 8 bags have been tossed.
- 🏆 The first team to reach 21 points wins. If the game lasts longer than 20 minutes, the team with the most points at the end of the 20 minutes will be the winner
